V. DATA ANALYSIS & INTERPRETATION

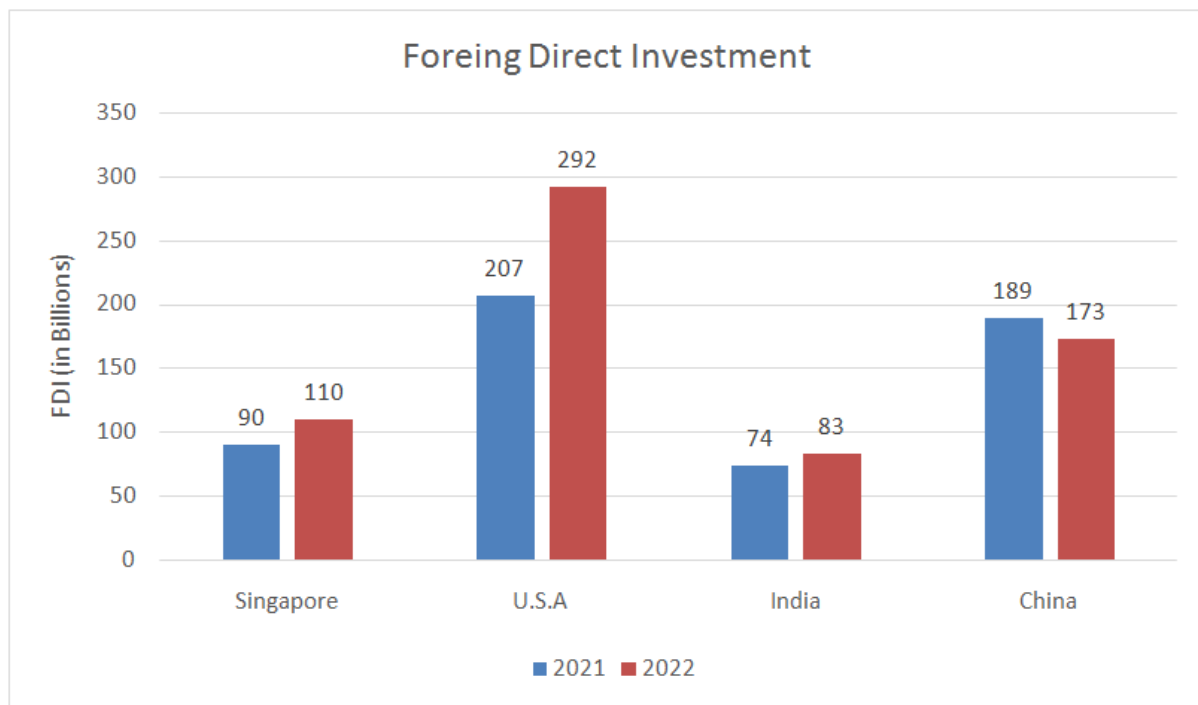


Fig. 5.1 Impact of IFD Agreement on FDI of Various countries

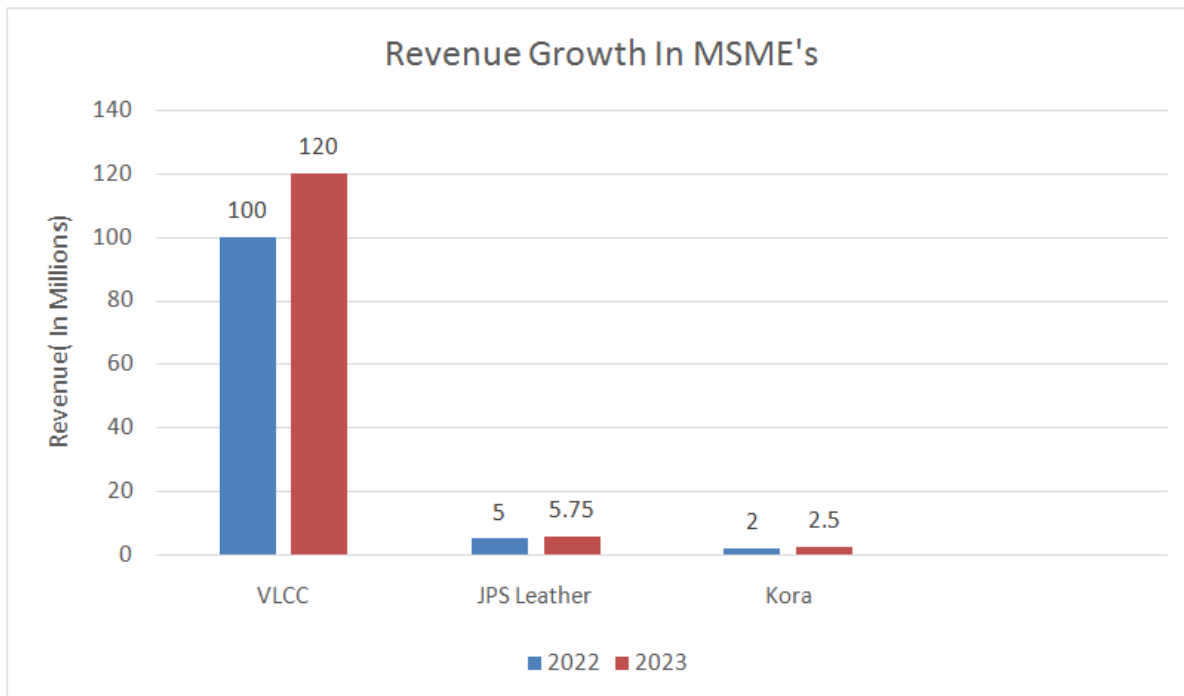


Fig 5.4 Revenue growth in MSME's
